The role:

To assist adults and children to deal with a wide range of issues including mental illness, grief & loss, depression, trauma, family and/or relationship matters, mental illness and any other issues which impact on social and emotional wellbeing.

Some of your key responsibilities will include, but may not be limited to:

- Provide clinical psychological and therapeutic services to improve the psychological wellbeing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people through the most appropriate framework and setting for the individual client.
- To contribute as a member of a multi-disciplinary care team to the development/and provision of recovery oriented clinical care plans for clients with identified mental health/psychological wellbeing issues.
- Encourage clients to access a range of social health and welfare services as required, which include other BNMAC programs and external agencies.
- Provide specialist, expert advice to clients and allied health professionals, primarily within BNMAC, to facilitate best practice and culturally appropriate mental health care.
- Undertake billing for services in alignment with Medicare and MBS protocols.
- Promote the service and BNMAC to peer agencies and potential referrers.
- Additional periodic or ongoing activities that may arise during the tenure of the role to meet client needs or otherwise as requested of the team manager.

Selection criteria:

- Registration as a Psychologist with Australia with the Psychology Board of Australia (AHPRA).
- Postgraduate qualifications and minimum 3 years' experience as a psychologist.
- Demonstrated ability to deliver a range of psychological therapies to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, young people and adults appropriate to support their personal recovery and healing.
- Commitment to delivery of trauma informed and strengths-based practice that delivers mental health treatments within a broader understanding of social and emotional wellbeing issues.
- Current NSW Working With Children Check
- Applicants must possess a current "C" Class Open Driver's License valid in NSW. Failure to keep that license will impact on your ability to hold this position.
