Job Purpose:

The Registered Nurse will take a proactive role to assist clients to address health issues in a holistic way at BNMAC's Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Service. BNMAC endeavors to take a proactive approach working with local communities to raise awareness of health issues and to develop and implement intervention strategies in the treatment of chronic conditions. The role requires a collaborative approach with the doctors and health workers to develop educational and intervention programs that address the contributory factors to wellness and empower clients to put in place a strategy that will improve their overall health and sense of wellbeing.

- Registered Nurse with at least 3 years' experience.
- Interest and experience in working with Aboriginal people and an understanding of the societal factors that influence Aboriginal health issues.
- Good organisational and time management skills.
- Ability to develop and follow a workplan and to work unsupervised
- Good communication skills with the ability to build a rapport with Aboriginal clients.
- Highly developed liaison skills with the proven ability to build good working relationships with service providers in the health field.
- Computer literacy.
- Able to work as part of a team multidisciplinary team in a community health environment.
- Current valid driver's license, minimum of Class "C" or equivalent
- Current First Aid Certificate, or ability to obtain
- National Police Check and NSW Working with Children clearance

Desirable

- Previous experience in an Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisation or in General Practice
- Immunisation Certificate and /or Women's Health qualifications
